Paddock Lane would remain a K – 5 building with Lincoln being K–2 and Stoddard 3–5. The Beatrice Board of Education would like parents to have the opportunity to review the options and give input prior to making the decision.

To Be (in school) or Not To Be (in school), That Is The Question

Just a few guidelines to help determine if a child should attend/return to school following illness or injury:

- Any student with a fever (100°+) should be kept home. Before returning to school the student shall be fever free (without the aid of fever reducing medication) for 24+ hours.
- Students experiencing vomiting and/or diarrhea should be kept home until free of these symptoms for 24+ hours.
- Any inflammation, sores, or matting seen on or in the eye(s) should be considered as potentially contagious and student should remain at home until symptom free and/or cleared by physician.
- Any open wounds or areas of infection need to be covered to protect your student and others from cross contamination.
- If your student is complaining of “flu-like” symptoms (body aches, chills, severe headache or sore throat) for more than 24 hours, please contact your physician for instruction.
- * If your child is determined to have Influenza, please report this to school nurse so that an accurate “count” may be shared with Public Health Solutions District Health Department; this gives a clearer view of the spread of illness throughout the state and may provide information on best course of action.
